


Kids' City of San Diego's 16th Annual POSTER CONTEST

WHO: 1st through 6th graders

WHAT: 2016 Water Conservation Poster Contest

WHEN: Entries due Friday, March 25, 2016

WHERE: Any student in the cities of San Diego, Coronado, and Imperial Beach

WHY: We use water daily. From drinking it, to fighting fires, to cleaning with it and growing our food, water is a valuable resource to us all. Together, San Diegans take care of it and conserve it as part of our lifestyle.

THEME: Why is water important to you? Draw a picture showing us your favorite way to use water, or the most important way that you think water is used.

The Prizes

PARTICIPATION: A certificate of participation will be given to every student who creates a poster.

PRIZES: Gift cards will be given for each grade level for 1st Place, 2nd Place, & 3rd Place. An Overall Winner for the Recycled Water Category will also win a gift card. These prizes for the winners will be presented at a San Diego City Council Presentation held in May 2016. Additionally, these winning posters will be displayed throughout the city all year.

The Official Stuff

OFFICIAL RULES

- 1) Open to the cities of San Diego, Coronado, and Imperial Beach public, private, and home-schooled 1st–6th graders.
- 2) All posters must be drawn horizontally (landscape) on 11" x 17" white poster paper.
- 3) Students may use crayon, watercolor, poster paint, markers, ink, cut paper, tissue paper or fabric. Please do not use materials that may smear, crack or chip. Students are encouraged to use large lettering, few words, heavy lines, & strong colors.
- 4) Students must work on posters independently. Collaborated work (a poster created by two (2) or more students) will be disqualified.
- 5) Only original artwork will be accepted. Computer-generated drawings will not be considered. Reproduction of popular cartoon characters or three-dimensional work will be disqualified.
- 6) Posters will not be returned. They will remain the property of the City of San Diego and may be reproduced.

CONTEST ENTRY

Attach the student entry form with tape to the back of each poster.

Teachers may submit three (3) water conservation posters and one (1) recycled water poster that illustrates this year's theme to represent your class.

Art Teachers may submit four (4) posters to represent each class, and combination classes may submit four (4) posters per grade level.
