Teachers receive special training throughout the year to support the principles of the IB program and develop curriculum that is taught in schools worldwide.

The mission of the IB Program is to develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect.

The IB program and mission statement form an umbrella to link all McKinley activities. The goal is to continually develop and strengthen all aspects of our learning environment and school culture to reflect high-quality, rigorous and challenging education programs for our children and to prepare them for the K-12 IB curriculum.




Funds raised by the PTC support McKinley's IB program by contributing funds to annual IB program fees and IB training courses for teachers and staff, funding Spanish classes, and enrichment classes such as ceramics, art and garden programs all designed to meet the IB learner profile.

Dine-Out

The McKinley Dine-Out program is a collaboration between McKinley families and North Park & South Park restaurants wherein selected restaurants give back a percentage of the nights proceeds to McKinley. McKinley Dine-Outs are typically held the third Thursday of each month. It's a great way to check out a new restaurant, have a family (or date) night out and maybe bump into a friend or two.

Dine-Out coordinators approach restaurants to participate, create a schedule, and submit communications requests to publicize the event.

Jog-a-thon (JAT)

The JAT, usually held in October, offers a fun opportunity for kids to get involved in raising money for McKinley. The jog-a-thon promotes physical fitness as the kids run laps around the school track. Kids can get their family, friends and neighbors to sponsor them via an online donation website or traditional methods. Every child receives a t-shirt with a student design that has been chosen by vote and all are entered to win prizes donated by local businesses and the general community.

The Jog-a-thon committee handles the logistics and planning of the event such as soliciting sponsors and organizing prizes but many hands are needed the day of to track laps, hand out water or oranges and make it a success.

Started in 2009, the Annual SoNo Fest and Chili Cook-Off is a major community event. In connection with San Diego Ceramic Connection, attendees purchase handmade ceramic bowls and try over 40 kinds of chili from local restaurants and community members. This huge festival features two stages of live music, massive local beer garden, local craft vendors, food trucks and a kid's zone. SoNo Fest is held the first Sunday of December on the corner of 32nd and Thorn Streets.

The SoNo Committee begins planning months in advance. About a dozen volunteers are needed to handle the core logistics but many (many!) more are needed on the day of the event. We need all hands on deck for SoNo.

School Site Council (SSC)

The SSC plans school goals and objectives, curriculum modifications, monitors progress and evaluates outcomes. The SSC is charged with the legal responsibility to ensure that services meet the needs of special student populations and oversee the Site Plan for Student Achievement. The SSC is also responsible for categorical funding, such as Title I and Second Language to help make decisions that ensure an outstanding and inclusive education program is at McKinley. The Council is made up of parents, the principal, teachers, school staff and community members. The council elects two members to act as the District Advisory Council (DAC) representative and the alternate. Focus on improving student achievement for all students. The SCC typically meets the first Tuesday of the month from 4:00-6:00pm in the library.
