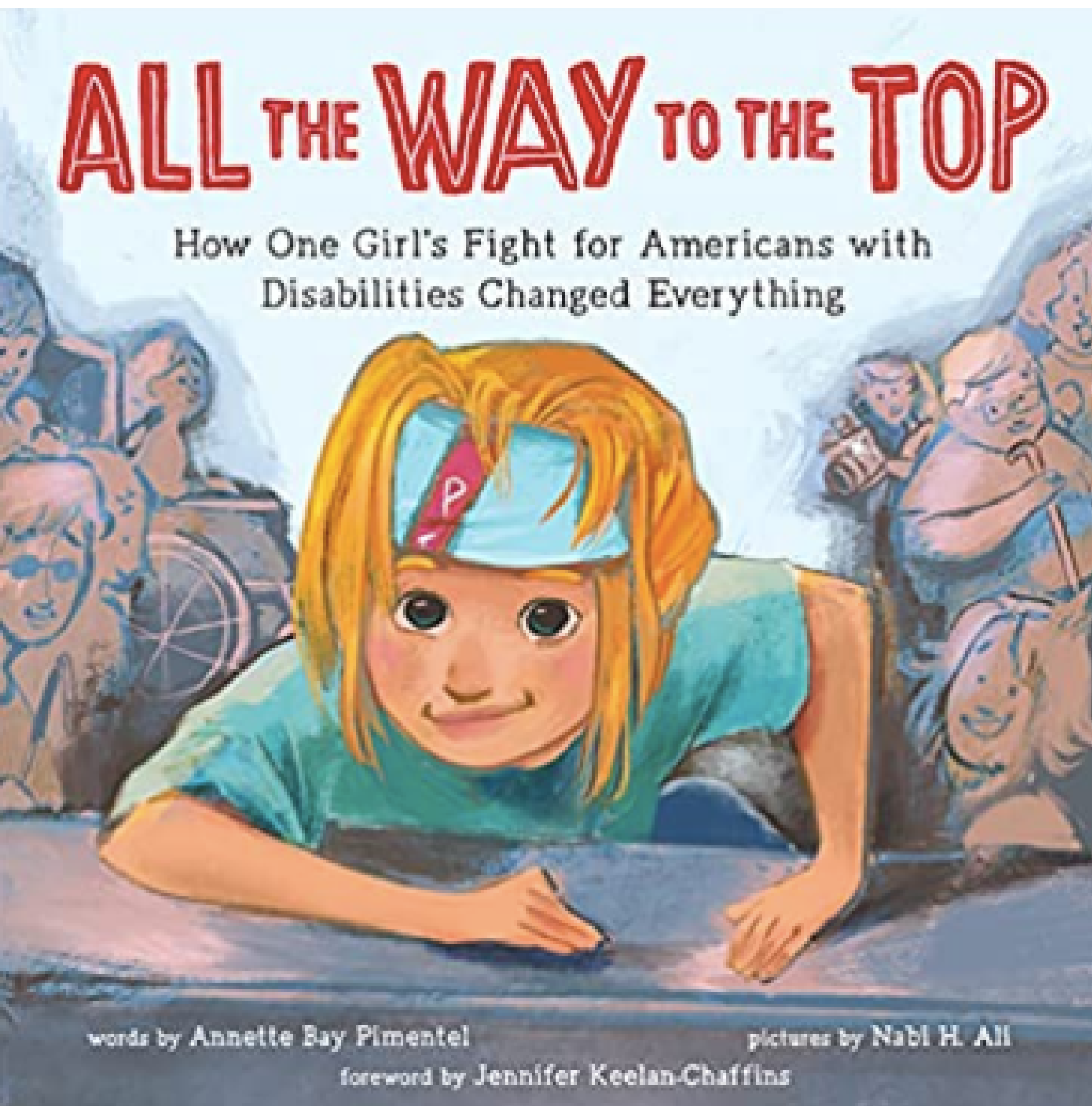

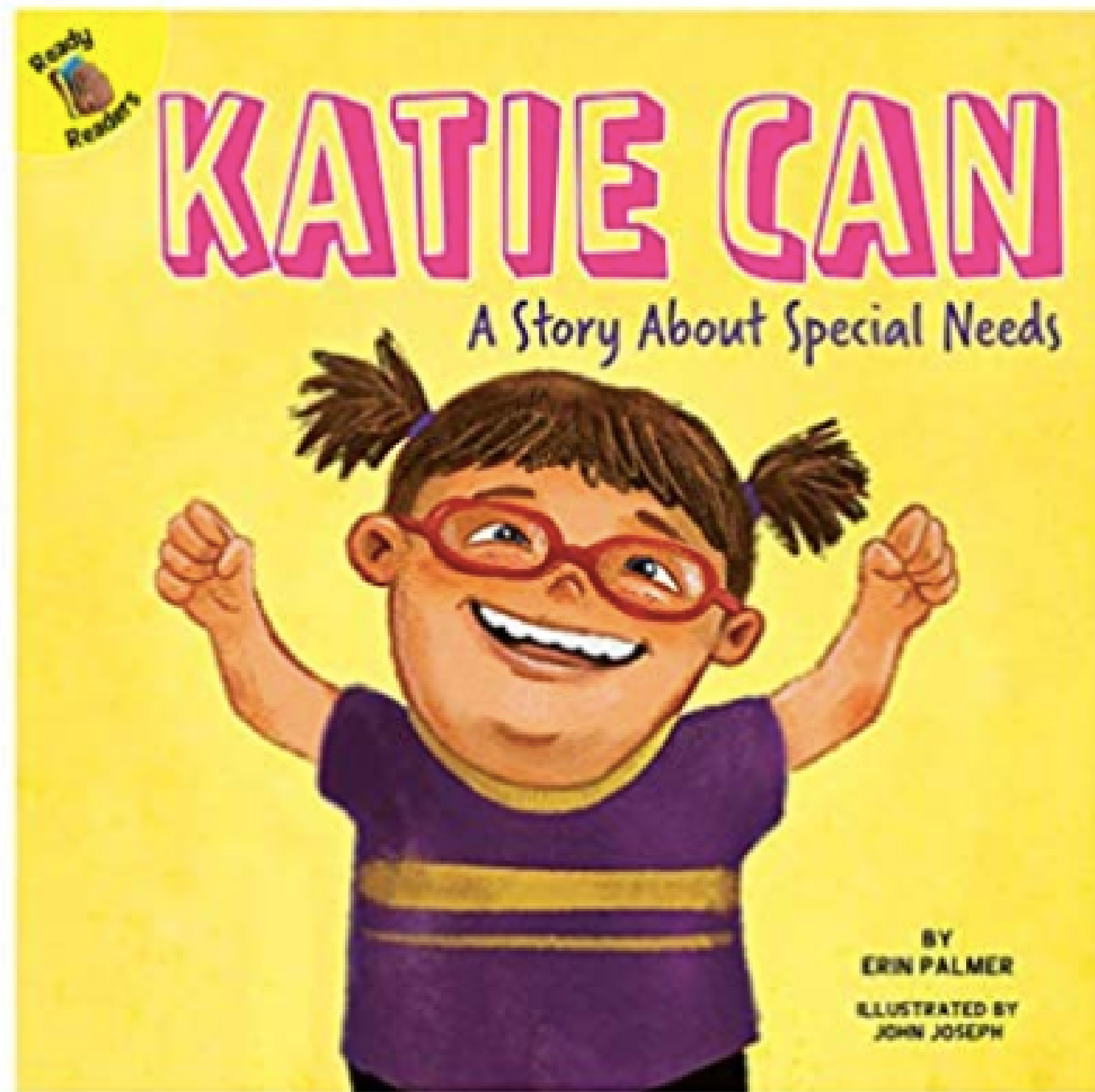

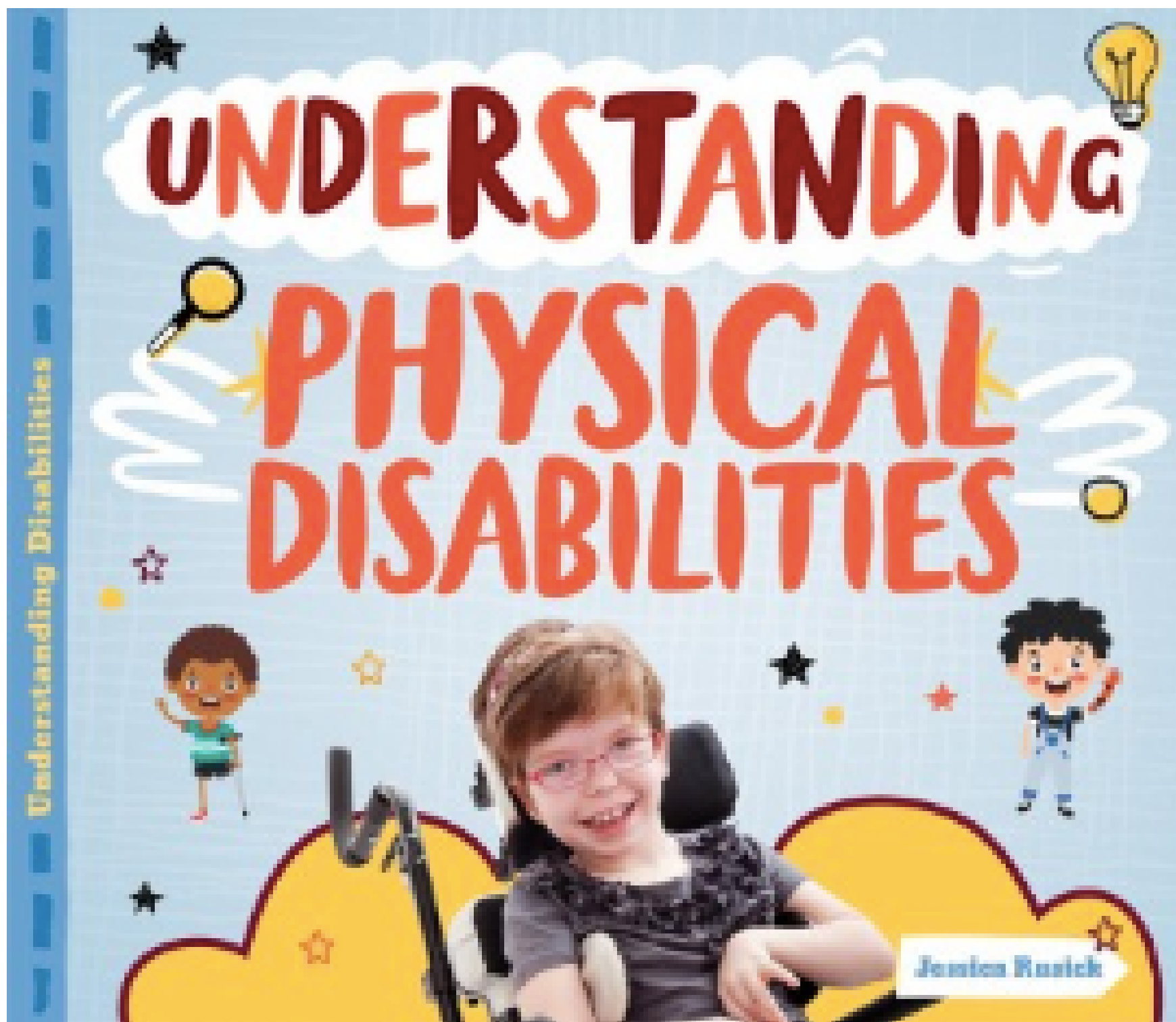
READING AGES: 4-8 YEARS

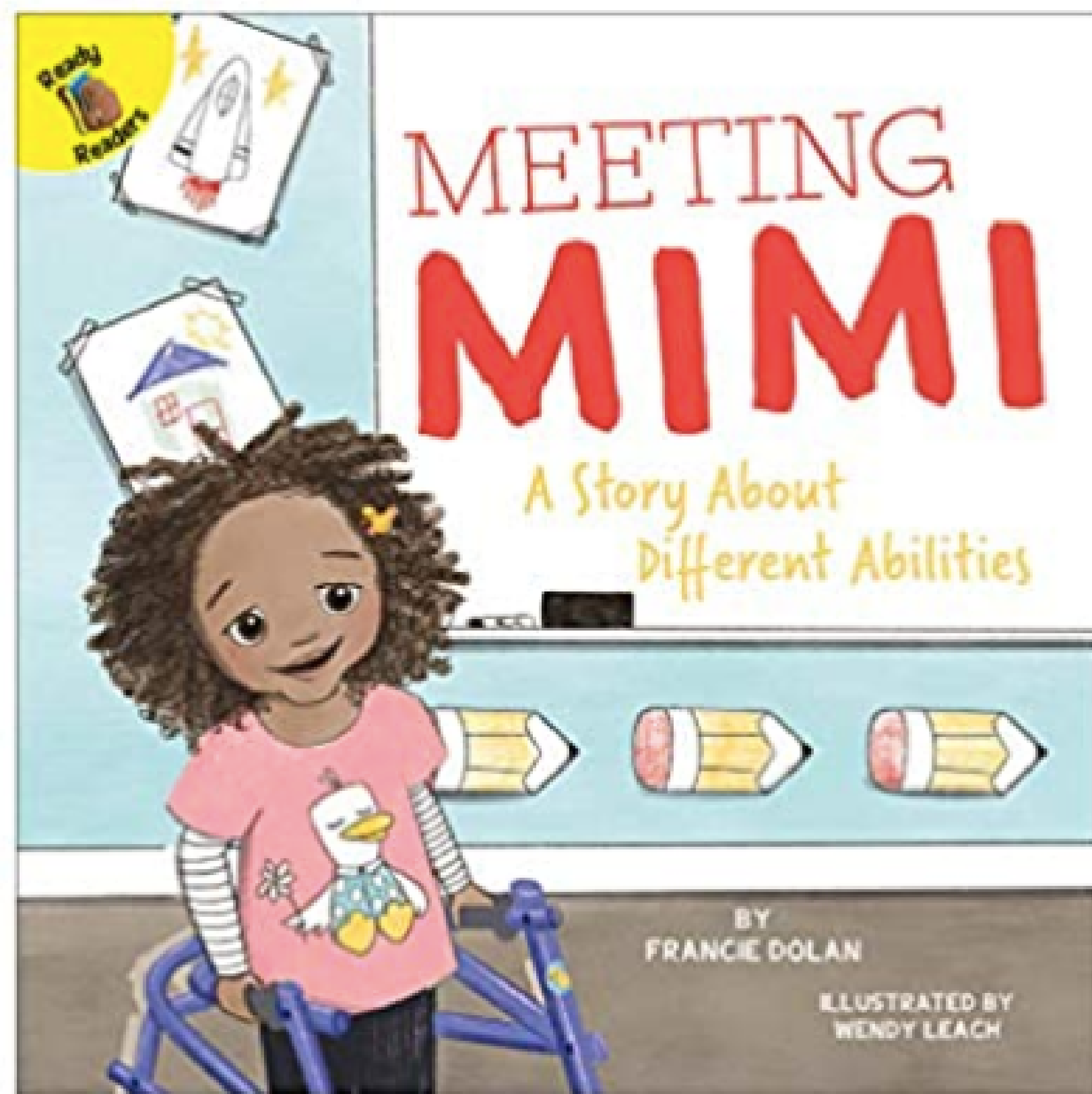

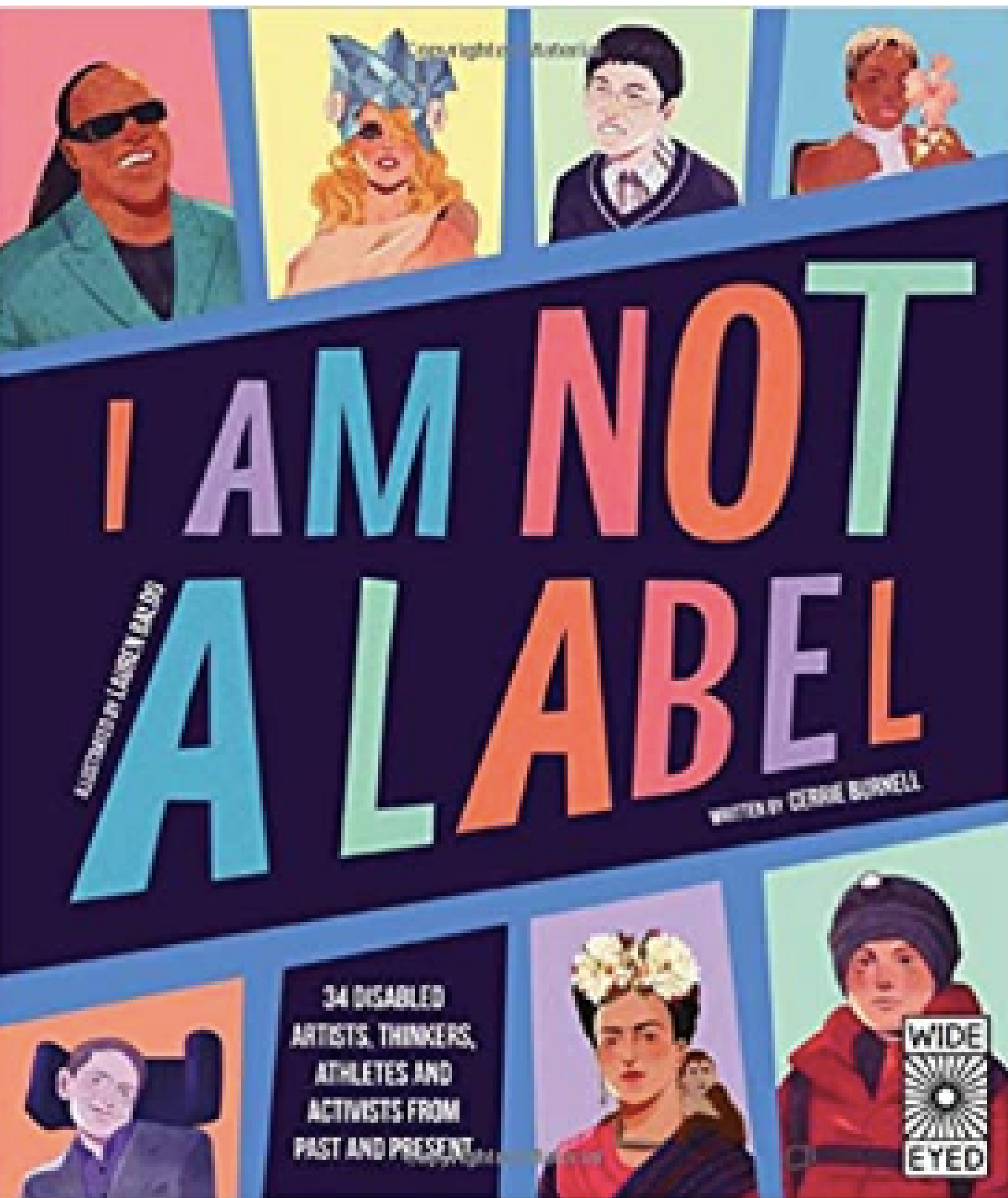
READING AGES: 4-8 YEARS
